## **Outreach Initiatives**

#### 1. Tours

KEXP Tours are offered 7 days/week, at 10:00 am and 2:00 pm June through August and 2:00 pm only September through May. They are free of charge and last approximately 45 minutes. They include information about the different job positions and departments at KEXP. We offer tours to locals, tourists, school groups and other community groups. Our program of tours is overseen by Susan James, Associate Director of Community Engagement.

Tours were temporarily suspended beginning in March 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic and continue to be on hold. KEXP is exploring virtual tours so we can continue to offer this program.

#### 2. Mastering the Hustle - Radio

11/9/2019

As part of the ongoing workshop series Mastering the Hustle, focused on helping emerging artists navigate the music industry, KEXP hosted a panel discussion on navigating radio stations in the region as an artist, student, or listener. The event also included a radio fair with opportunities for participants to engage with local streaming and low power FM stations KBFG, Hollow Earth Radio, SPACE 101.1, KVRU, KMIH, KUPS, and Rainier Avenue Radio.

#### 3. Internships

KEXP's internship program seeks to provide interns from historically under-invited communities with hands-on experience in the nonprofit arts sector. Our program is designed to develop and equip emerging leaders interested in furthering their careers in a broad array of fields including music programming and production, audio engineering, education, and events.

Our interns learn skills in business communication, project management, problem-solving, audio technology, database management and more. These skills and experiences offer our interns a unique ground-level glimpse of the day-to-day life of a community-supported radio station and arts organization, while offering relationship building and networking opportunities with individuals throughout the music industry. All internships are paid a stipend.

Internships are a 6 month commitment from May to November. Our interns come from a variety of Seattle-area colleges and universities, including the University of Washington and Shoreline Community College. We also have students who volunteer with us who attend Franklin High School, Northwest School, Highline College, and Gibson Ek High School.

The internship program for 2020 was cancelled due to the COVID-19 pandemic and the challenges of hosting a remote internship. The positions below ran through November 2019.

## 4. Employee Training Program

KEXP has established a professional development program for staff that funds work-related training on an individual or team level through applications to a centrally-held budget, assessed and decided by Rebecca Denk, Director of Finance & HR, and Elisabeth Severson, HR Manager. In addition, broadly applicable training on multiple subjects has been provided to staff members through optional sessions held at KEXP.

## 5. **EEO Training**

KEXP requires all staff to complete harassment prevention and anti-discrimination training annually. Supervisors attend a training specifically tailored to them that covers their responsibilities as representatives of the organization to report behavior, respond to complaints, and foster a culture of inclusivity.
