Outreach Initiatives

1. Internship Fairs and Career Days

McKenna Haley, Community Engagement Manager, and Mathilde Xiao, Community Engagement Coordinator, participated in the following career and internship fair by distributing information about our internship and volunteer programs, collecting resumes, gathering email addresses, and answering questions about the station:

2. Professional Development Program

KEXP has established a professional development program for staff that funds work-related training, classes, and conferences on an individual or team level through applications to a centrally-held budget, assessed and decided by Rebecca Denk, Director of Finance & HR, and Elisabeth Severson, Associate Director of HR. In addition, broadly applicable training on multiple subjects has been provided to staff members through optional sessions held at KEXP.

3. EEO Training

KEXP requires all staff to complete harassment prevention and anti-discrimination training annually. Members of hiring teams at KEXP are also required to complete unconscious bias training prior to conducting interviews. The training is a virtual, ondemand session through KEXP's human resources information system.

4. Youth DJ Program

KEXP offers a free education program teaching youth the art of music curation and radio. Working with KEXP DJs, young music-lovers gain knowledge and training in music curation, board operation, physical and digital asset management,

mentorship, and basic radio skills. Youth also gain insight into non-commercial public community radio with classes taking place at the KEXP studio.

The program is one month long, from September 2, 2021 – October 7, 2021. Students who complete the full training may join a cohort of rotating hosts for KEXP's youth show 90.TEEN.

5. Teaching Artists Program

KEXP's Teaching Artists program connects teachers and nonprofit leaders in the Pacific Northwest with professionals working within the music radio industry to enrich curriculum and connect with students. The program is made available at no cost to Title I eligible public schools and includes stipend payments to the artists. In the 2020-2021 license year, eleven one-off classes and one long-term program totaling seven classes were conducted.

Teaching Artists are professionals, including both KEXP staff and members of the wider community, who offer 30-90 minute classes in the following areas:

- Radio DJing
- Audio Engineering
- Videography
- Music Journalism
- Broadcast Engineering
- Music
- General Music Industry

6. Internships

KEXP's internship program seeks to provide interns from historically under-invited communities with hands-on experience in the nonprofit arts sector. Our program is designed to develop and equip emerging leaders interested in furthering their careers in a broad array of fields including music programming and production, audio engineering, education, and events.

Our interns learn skills in business communication, project management, problem-solving, audio technology, database management and more. These skills and experiences offer our interns a unique ground-level glimpse of the day-to-day life of a community-supported radio station and arts organization, while offering relationship building and networking opportunities with individuals throughout the music industry. All internships are paid.

Internships are a 6 month commitment from April to October. Our interns come from a variety of Seattle-area colleges and universities, including the University of Washington and Shoreline Community College. We also have students who volunteer with us who attend Franklin High School, Northwest School, Highline College, and Gibson Ek High School.

Our internship program is administrated by Andrea Friedman, Community Engagement Manager, and Mathilde Xiao, Community Engagement Coordinator. The internship program was on hold due to COVID-19 for 2020 and 2021 but will resume in 2022.
